Kids should be treated not like criminals.

Kids who are already here need to be energized – they are ambassadors to attract other students.

Couldn't get back to LA after Eliz fast enough.

HS kids need to be defended at board level and at school level.

## John Bleich

Parents who just have ES kids need to think beyond ES.

These parents need to be informed about the great HS kids.

Communication is a huge factor. Board is all behind the HS and focused on it.

## Krystal Kroeker

When do we pull kids out of HS to have them interact with ES?

Schedule already a challenge to get HS curriculum taught. No time for additional activities integrating HS and lower grades.

There is, however, no prohibition on HS, ES interaction.

3, 6 and 7<sup>th</sup>.

Likes conservative nature of school. Not motivated by extra curricular activities.

Character is more important than activities.

Wants to see HS succeed and wants to help.

### John Bleich

Pres. of board.

Excited that HS was proposed. Proposal was to create a college prep HS.

Other than a couple incidents, HS kids are terrific.

Some parents are not thinking into the future.

Safety, minimal peer pressure due to smaller school size, advantages.

Some parents want HS closed.

We need to make enough money to finish the school and open channels between all parties.

How to retain MS students and have them continue into HS?

MS - HS continuity is the exception rather than the norm.

### Tammy Acosta

It comes down to finances. We hired a French teacher for every HS class. Rules. Waivers? No federal waivers on teacher requirements per class.

### Ms. Hannigan

General question about money and teachers.

## John Bleich

If we had a wait list for a couple years, then bonding company would rate us higher and we could get more bond money and hire teachers and build buildings.

If C1 doesn't share their mil levy then it compromises our teacher salaries.

## Mike Anthony

Enrollment must precede facility build out.

General discussion about mill levy, community perceptions, what share of C1 new mill levy will actually benefit the charter school. We have 10% of the school district population, and that 10% is more active than rest of community.

Students leave for activities, social opportunities. Greg S. – sports and academics are the main reasons. Electives, classes out of sequence, ability to take courses when they need to take courses. Our schedule process is too tight. Electives and competitive sports opportunities. Our students are eligible at other district schools.

3-7-11-19 Senior, Junior, Sophomore, Freshman, current student counts

Academics are much better here than any place else in Elbert county – sounds like it's schedule flexibility that is the problem.

Item 2 of agenda. How to recruit charter and home school students to LA?
