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"We" and "they". It is typical of any group of government employees, located in Washington, D.C., or a state capitol or a county seat. From that perspective, it's easy to determine who is favor of raising taxes and who is not.

Look at each player in the current situation your facing today. Who qualifies as a "we"? and who qualifies as a "they"? Liberal democrats and "we" are in favor of raising taxes.

Government employees have a disproportionate advantage in the ECR, because they are automatically members, while the "they" are represented by 30 precinct committee people.

I hope the issue of raising taxes or not is a major topic at each of the caucus meetings, with a formal vote and a summary of those votes presented at County Convention. To fail to bring this issue to Republicans assembled at caucus would be a major mistake of the Resolutions Committee.
