

The problem is too much government

If all the waste, fraud and abuse in government were eliminated, there would still be too much government.

If the bureaucracy was expertly managed by great leadership, there would still be too much government.

If political differences between the parties were amicably resolved and all the bureaucrats worked together in perfect harmony, there would still be too much government.

If spending was closely coupled to outcomes, there would still be too much government.
